Guests:

- Keith Bertram Local Conservation Officer DNR
  - ATV problems have been reduced
  - Jet Ski rules: 150' from shore is the Slow, No-Wake Zone. Must be off the lake 1 hour before sunset. Report violators to DNR/Sheriff
  - Boaters: No-wake zones are not posted on Lake Beauty, primarily due to its size.
  - Temporary no-wake signs are available during high water times.
  - Fishing leagues most are operating under the number of boats regulated. Not anything to be done.
  - There is no speed limit on Lake Beauty
  - Night fishing lights are to shine into the water; however, they reflect to shore. Must be 150' out from residence, not 150' from the shore. Positive result is the removal of rough fish. Please note there are angler protection rules – anglers cannot be blocked from fishing. Also, anglers should not be dumping fish at the access or road ditches. Some organic farmers will buy the fish for fertilization.

- Eric Altena DNR Area Fishing Manager
  - 21 years with MN. Here since 2008. Cell 320-293-2439 eric.altena@state.mn.us
  - We have good water resources in this area
  - Lake update most walleye are stocked, including Beauty which is a bass and pan fish system.
  - The walleye population is affected by the number of pike in Beauty.
  - Next survey 2023.
  - No stocking this year due to Covid Eric shared the stocking process.
  - NEW Quality Bluegill Initiative (QBI)
    - Program to increase the size of sunfish over time.
    - Lake Beauty is one of the lakes in the program.
    - QBI meeting to discuss goals and processes: Sept 30, 6-8pm at Long Prairie City Hall
    - If implemented, will start in March 2021
    - For more information go to MNDNR.gov and type in sunfish
  - Shore land habitat encourages buffer areas reducing the impact of docks as well as reducing fertilization usage. Riprap is less effective than trees and plants to minimize runoff.
- Deja Anton Todd County Soil and Water
  - Lake Beauty has biological significance.
    - Only 9% of Lake Beauty's shoreline disturbed. 40% is a problem.
    - No extreme pollutants.
  - Lake Beauty has protected lake status
  - County will continue to
    - monitor and improve the shoreline
    - maintain forest management
    - reduce phosphorus from 21.8 to 19 ppm
  - Shared information on septic and how payments are set up. Applications are available from Todd County.
  - Riparian Aid grant dollars available.
